Please join us on 9/6 for a Hot Dog BBQ and a Welcome to our new Rabbi, Jack Shlachter It is with anticipation and some trepidation that I write this, my first message to all of you at the Jewish Center of the Moriches (JCM). My wife, Beverly, and I visited JCM last December with a vague idea that I *might* get a job offer from Brookhaven National Laboratory some day and that we *might* end up relocating to Long Island from New Mexico. Lo and behold, I recently started my job at Brookhaven Lab and we now also have the privilege of serving as the rabbi and rebbitzen for the congregation. While some of you have already heard my story during the interview process, others are likely completely unaware who is writing this message. You can find some of my background at www.physicsrabbi.com, but the shortened version is that I have been a full-time physicist my entire career, working at Los Alamos National Laboratory in northern New Mexico for several decades. I acquired rabbinic ordination nearly 25 years ago, inspired by my love of Judaism and the dearth of rabbis to serve our community. I've been following simultaneously these two seemingly disparate paths, in physics and the rabbinate, for many years, and I am excited to begin the next chapter with two new positions, at Brookhaven Laboratory and at JCM respectively.

Although Beverly and I are far from settled, I've already launched into preparations for the upcoming High Holidays. The saddest day on the Jewish calendar, Tisha B'Av, marking the destruction of the First and Second Temples in Jerusalem, is rapidly approaching, and only a few weeks afterwards we begin the preparatory month of Elul leading up to Rosh HaShanah, then Yom Kippur, Sukkot, and finally Simchat Torah in quick succession. I'm hoping to offer a few evening discussion sessions before Rosh HaShanah to help remind ourselves of the High Holiday liturgy and share some insights about this special time of year. Elul is a time to ask forgiveness for anything hurtful we may have said or done to those around us.

My thanks go to Cantor Erica Rubin for providing me with documentation on services at JCM, as well as to Board President Michael Leselrod for his encouragement during the rabbinic search. Steve and Sherry Schwartz graciously opened their home to me with delicious meals and a welcoming demeanor...much appreciated as I've been eating my own cooking while waiting for Beverly to arrive.

I am truly looking forward to leading what is obviously a very special community, rich in tradition and with an admirable mix of backgrounds and experiences. Please be sure to introduce yourselves to me when we see each other at shul, and you are always welcome to e-mail me at physicsrabbi@gmail.com if you have questions or just want to chat.

By the way, there is a tradition of blowing the shofar once each morning in Elul to wake us from our lethargy and remind us that we should be examining our lives and making course corrections as appropriate. If you catch wind that a ram's horn was heard on the Laboratory site, now you'll be among the very few who know why.


Familyhood Greeting

Friday night services only last about an hour and a half. Please try to attend as often as possible so we have a Minyan.
