#### D'Var HaRav (The Rabbi's Message)

#### Lights, Camera, Action – Yontif!

This issue of the Shofar should arrive just before the High Holidays. Rabbis, cantors, choirs, and other Jewish spiritual leaders are frantically writing sermons, reviewing the liturgy, practicing their singing, rehearsing their Torah readings. Task Force members are rushing to finalize their COVID protocols, making arrangements for hiring guards to provide extra physical security, testing video telecommunications equipment, sending out Yizkor forms, soliciting donations. Board members are frantically organizing onegs, purchasing floral arrangements, cleaning the building, hiring greeters. But what is the **congregant** to be doing as we approach the solemn Days of Awe? Maybe just plan to show up on Rosh HaShanah to enjoy (or endure) the show?

In fact, the most important player in the entire High Holiday experience is you! Too often, we think of the worship service as a performance, with the congregants as the audience. But in actuality, the prayer leader is the prompter, the congregants are the "actors," and God is the "audience." The days leading up to the holidays are our rehearsal time, and we would all be wise to spend some time learning our lines, i.e., reflecting on what questions we want to ask of ourselves and what practices we want to follow during the services to dig within our own souls for answers – to kindle the Divine sparks we each nurture. Why are we here, what is the purpose of our lives, how can we live them meaningfully, how did we do over the past year and what can we redirect in our behavior in the coming year? These are just some of the existential queries we may want to focus on during this year's High Holidays.

Whatever topics you choose to emphasize as you "act" during the High Holidays, I look forward to seeing you either live or on Zoom beginning this year on Monday, September 6th at 7 PM. Break a leg!

#### High Holiday Survey

Thanks to all who responded to JCM's High Holiday survey. The survey was sent out by email, and was also available (via JCM volunteers) to those who preferred to answer the questions by phone. The vast majority of survey respondents reported that all members of their family aged 12 and over are vaccinated. Overwhelmingly, our congregational family responded that they would like JCM to require proof of vaccination for those attending High Holiday services in person in the building. Many people are still feeling uncomfortable coming to services in person. JCM has continued to offer a Zoom option for Shabbat services and we will also be offering this option for High Holiday services.

#### **High Holiday Tickets**

Please note that no physical High Holiday tickets will be printed this year. All members are entitled to attend High Holiday services as a membership benefit; your name will be on the High Holiday list at the door. Non-members, as usual, can purchase "tickets" (no physical tickets this year) – cost is \$175 per person. Contact Judy Hean at 631-878-0466 for non-member tickets. Please be aware that because of Covid-19, all non-members wishing to attend services must purchase tickets prior to the holiday. Thank you for your understanding. You can also participate in High Holiday services via Zoom (no charge; donation requested).

#### High Holiday Machzors (prayerbooks)

Once again, machzors will be available for loan for the duration of the holidays. If you're planning to attend some of the services via Zoom, we encourage you to borrow a machzor. And if at any time you're feeling ill during the holidays, we ask that you stay home and participate via Zoom.

#### Being friendly without befriending germs

Unfortunately, the Covid-19 pandemic is still with us. Even though many of us are fully vaccinated, we still have many members in the community who feel vulnerable. We have members and friends above age 50, people with underlying health conditions, and households with children under age 12 who are not yet eligible for vaccination.

#### **PLEASE:**

Refrain from physical contact with non-family members:

NO handshaking, kissing, hugs
YES waving hello, big smiles, fist bumps, elbow-to-elbow greetings

We are SO sorry to have to ask this, but please understand that catching even a little sniffle is sending people anxiously to their doctor or to get tested for Covid. Thank you for your cooperation in helping all of us feel safe at synagogue!

The JCM owns cemetery plots in Mt Pleasant Cemetery. These plots are for sale and occasionally someone contacts us to sell back their plot. Selling back plots involves the owner mailing the deed back, and coordinating with JCM's treasurer to send a check to the plot seller. Buying or selling back plots are fairly rare occurrences; usually this comes up once a year.

#### \*Newsletter Team

Create the "Shofar Newsletter", email it to the printer, pick it up from the printer, mail it. Newsletter format mostly stays the same with each issue. JCM is currently producing four newsletters per year, with one person acting as "editor" (collecting and/or writing newsletter content), another person doing graphic design, and a third person picking up the printed newsletter from the photocopy shop and mailing the newsletters.

#### \*Membership Liaison

Talk to prospective members when they contact the Jewish Center with questions: explain our programs, services, Hebrew School, and member pricing. This person is the "welcoming contact" that interacts with prospective members.

#### \*Ritual Committee

Works with the Spiritual Leader to integrate traditional Jewish practices, guidelines, and prayers into Shabbat and festival services, life cycle events, and other JCM activities. Endeavors to make JCM's religious atmosphere welcoming, inclusive, and accessible.

#### **Sunshine Committee**

Contacts sick/hospitalized members and sends condolences on behalf of the JCM community.

#### \*Phone "Keep in Touch" Committee

JCM is looking for a few additional people to join Judy Hean and Rabbi Jack in making "keep in touch" phone calls to community members. Each committee member will be given a list of people to contact on an occasional basis.
